

## **Tax Alumni Come Back to the Classroom**

In early October, ten Pace Law alumni returned to the classroom to speak about their careers in tax law. Nine of these alumni are former students of Professor Bridget Crawford and completed her federal tax class as students; all enjoy successful tax-related careers.
